

While Swiss artist Hans Erni (1909-2015) is best known for his posters and designs for stamps and Olympic medals, the dedication drawings he often made for his friends are compelling demonstrations of his skill as a draughtsman.

The present volume features a goddess of lithography drawn by Erni for English artist Rigby Graham (1931-2015). Like Erni, Graham was an accomplished printmaker, with lithography being his preferred medium. Erni refers to this affinity by placing a Hellenistic woman atop a printing press alongside the inscription 'for Rigby a lithographic reminder'.



Erni found frequent inspiration in mythology and his figures, composed of energetic lines, evoke the work of contemporaries like Picasso as much as the Greek vessels which originally bore these subjects.







For thirty-six years, the publication documented both the gallery's exhibitions and as well as the impressive post-war output of graphic work. In addition to original colour lithographs by Canadian artist Jean-Paul Riopelle, the edition includes texts by André du Bouchet, Pierre Schneider, Jean-Luc de Rudder and Jacques Dupin. Also includes a catalogue of 25 paintings and 8 sculptures exhibited at the Maeght Gallery. Text in French.

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



The present volume features five original lithographs by Maurice de Vlaminck, printed the year of his death. Although known primarily for his oil paintings, the autographic medium of lithography allowed Vlaminck to translate his expressive brushtrokes onto the plates. Aditionally, the medium enabled Vlaminck to explore a monochromatic pallete, unusual for the Fauvist artist. The prints were pulled in Paris by the Mourlot Frères atelier who printed other notable artists like Braque, Matisse, and Picasso.

Whistler was almost solely responsible for England's first revival of artistic lithography in the late nineteenth century. He increasingly understood his prints as original works of art, calling them 'Songs on Stone'. He even commented on the medium's value for the artist, writing '...lithography reveals the artist in his true strength as a draughtsman ... – for the line comes straight from his pencil – and the tone has no further fullness than he himself, in his knowledge, gave it ...'





While Whistler stopped producing

lithographs by the turn of the century, the present 1914 publication demonstrates lithography's revitalisation in the early years of the 20th century when the medium was enthusiastically promoted by the Senefelder Club for the Advancement of Artistic Lithography. The renewed interest was partly in response to the earlier Etching Revival, of which Whistler was a key figure.





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




